PLENTY OF ACTION OFF COURT DURING NATIONS CUP REST DAY

While there may have been no action on court at Toa Payoh Sports Hall today, the Nations Cup teams were busy elsewhere!

The Republic of Ireland took time out from their active recovery day to meet up with Fuchun Secondary School at the Kallang Netball Centre who 'adopted' the Irish this year and have been supporting them at their matches throughout the week.

18 pupils aged between 13-15 years old enjoyed learning from the experienced Coach of Ireland Kaylea McQuade along with national players Jan Hynes, Trish Fanning and Sinead O'Connor. After their warm-up they worked on defensive techniques then played a short game and had the chance to ask the players a range of questions.

This is the second year Netball Singapore has run the 'Adopt A Nation' programme where schools can support a Nation throughout the competition and receive special ticket prices and the chance of a clinic with their chosen team.

Later in the day, the USA team were hosted by the American Club, Singapore where they enjoyed a team dinner by the poolside and were then the special guests for their annual official Christmas tree switch-on.

This is the team's first visit to Singapore so they thoroughly enjoyed getting to experiencing a little bit of home from home.

The sports shoes get laced up again tomorrow as the competition moves into the final group matches that will determine the play-off positions for Saturday's finals.

Singapore currently hold top spot on the table but Papua New Guinea and Uganda are hot on their heels, just one point behind so the hosts must take victory over the USA to secure their chance for the title.

Matches begin at 3pm at Toa Payoh Sports Hall.
